virtual symposium. The Mississippi Hospital Association will manage registration for the event. Continuing Education credit approvals are pending approval through AXIS.

In addition to presentations already announced, ESO/ DI will provide a registry class. The class will provide



participants a 4-hour webinar session with instruction on the

abstraction of data in the MS Web-based Trauma Registry, including configuring the provider menu, injury coding, and use of the reporting tools (Report Runner and Driller) from the MS web portal.

We have extended the virtual symposium from a 20-hour event to a 24-hour event.

STN Virtual Rural TOPIC Courses Scheduled in April.

This course will provide education and a better understanding of trauma care's Performance Improvement process to Level 4 and Level 3 (those in small communities or low trauma volume) trauma

The TOPIC course is available to all trauma system team members who participate in the ongoing assessment, evaluation, and improvement of trauma care. TOPIC focuses on the ongoing

assessment of the continuum of trauma care with a structured review of process and trauma patient outcomes with a unique focus on rural trauma center processes.

The TOPIC course is provided in a 6-hour interactive modular format. The course offers practical application from entry level to mature phase of program development. The modules are taught with a focus on didactic, operational definitions, sample tools, case study examples, and take-home points.

Newton County Hosts Stop the Bleed Training for Local Law Enforcement

The number one cause of preventable death after an injury is bleeding. On February 23, 2021, MTCSF provided twenty-two law enforcement officers from Newton County Sheriff's Department, Decatur Police Department, Hickory Police Department, and East Central Community College **Stop the Bleed** training.

In addition to classroom training and Certificates of Completion, each officer is presented with a Stop the Bleed kit containing a tourniquet, wound packing compression wrap, warming gauze, blanket, and other essentials to stop bleeding on citizens, fellow officers, or themselves. Funding for Stop the Bleed kits/supplies is provided through the Mississippi State Department of Health's Trauma System of Care. The classes are provided as a community outreach of the Mississippi Trauma Care System Foundation.

John Gardner, Instructor, extends a special thanks to Sherrif Joedy Pennington and Chief Deputy Kris Hollingsworth for their interest in providing life-saving education to local officers and for supporting officer education and safety.
