The Mississippi Trauma Care System Foundation is pleased to host the third annual statewide trauma symposium at the Golden Nugget Resort and Casino in beautiful Biloxi, MS. This year's conference offers trauma center and ambulance service participants the opportunity to assemble as a statewide team. The 2023 theme will address disparities in trauma care. Speakers are selected to present subject matter on identifying, eliminating, or safely navigating care disparities. Speakers from in-state and out-of-state trauma centers are on the agenda.

This four-day event is a comprehensive learning opportunity that begins with two days of pre-conference skills and certifications May 1-2. Four tracks will be available—a Cadaver Lab Track, Registry Track, Skills Track, and ABLS track. The courses are scheduled and duplicated to allow attendees to fill their days during the pre-course training and participate in most, if not all, offerings.

The MS Trauma Symposium will begin with registration in the pre-conference area on Wednesday morning, May 3, 2023. David Hall, the Director of the Office of EMS and Acute Care Systems, State EMS Director, Mississippi State Department of Health, begins a day of lectures providing information on the current and future state of the trauma system. The first day combines general and breakout



### Bywy Fire Department Host Life-Saving County-Wide Training

Chief John Ballard and the volunteers at the Bywy Fire Department hosted a Choctaw county-wide training event on January 5, 2023, at the fire department.

The event was very successful, evidenced by forty-six attendees.



Included in the class were representatives from six fire departments,

Sheriff Brandon Busby and staff at the Choctaw County Sheriff's Department, Ackerman Chief of Police, Tim Cook and police department staff, MS Wildlife, Fisheries & Parks, and 911 dispatchers.

MTCF Education Coordinator Matt Edwards, MSN, working with Chief Ballard, provided training in life-saving steps for these first responders to identify and stop life-threatening bleeding.

STOP THE BLEED® is the result of a collaborative effort led by the American College of Surgeons Committee on Trauma (ACS COT) to bring knowledge of bleeding control to the public.
