Partnering to Educate Mississippi Emergency Medical Technicians.

For years, the Trauma Foundation has



partnered with the Mississippi Fire Academy to provide law enforcement and first responders with Stop the Bleed Training and tourniquet kits.

MTCSF staff initially

provided the training, but academy instructors have trained the most recent courses because of the collaboration between John Gardner, MSTCSF Executive Director, and Rob Fisher, Instructor Chief, EMS at the State Fire Academy.

MTCSF recently provided this group with tourniquet kits after completing their training on Sept. 25, 2023, led by Charles Weathersby, Mississippi State Fire Academy Instructor.



South Central Regional Medical Center Host Rural Trauma Team Development® Course

Rule 6.3.1. Mississippi Trauma System of Care Rules and Regulations states, "All physicians mid-level providers and (Physician Assistant/Nurse Practitioner) on the trauma team responsible for directing the initial resuscitation of the trauma patients must be currently certified in The American College of Surgeons Advanced Trauma Life Support (ATLS). ATLS requirements are waived for Board Certified Emergency Medicine and Board Certified General Surgery Physicians. Rural Trauma Team Development Course (RTTDC) may be substituted for ATLS at Level IV Trauma Centers." In addition, Emergency nurses staffing the trauma resuscitation area must be a current provider in TNCC, ATCN, or RTTDC within the last four years.

These rules make RTTDC an excellent option for our Level IV providers who may or may not have taken ATLS or TNCC to develop a team for trauma care. RTTDC is a one-day course, allowing less time away for the trauma center staff. It is more affordable. The training will improve decision-to-transfer times and improve trauma patient outcomes.

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Trauma Program Manager Tabitha Hutchinson, Dr. Chad Saul, and CEO Gregg Gibbes hosted an RTTDC course on September 14. The USA Health, University Hospital in Mobile team provided the course to twenty-three attendees.

as a winner of MTCSF's Circle of Excellence Award during the MS Trauma System of Care Symposium in May for their support in a Winston County mass casualty event. The




